This summer, Classical Studies students traveled widely for their research!


- Charlee Mandy participated in the Marzuolo Archaeological Project in Tuscany, Italy.

- Abby Breuker joined the Center for the Ancient Mediterranean's Annual Graduate Tour to this year's destination, Cyprus.


